St. Martin's News

Hi! Sorry we missed the last issue! Trust you are all enjoying this summer (?) weather, the uncertainty of which reminds one of Scottish summers of years ago. It has to be said though, that the rain does give the benefit of not having to water thirsty plants.

The work on the inside South Wall has now been completed, and we are very pleased with the resultant appearance - albeit that it does highlight the need for something similar on the North Wall, which now looks positively grubby by comparison. The lightning conductor work has been completed, and (expensively) interesting to note that the earthing probes had to go down forty feet before acceptable readings were achieved! It cost £35/metre for the probes. The only outstanding piece of work to be completed now is the restoration of the choir stall behind the vicar's stall. No pressure has been applied to the progress of this, and it should be re-installed soon. It has been quite satisfying to see the work progressed to the final result. Now we have to have the patience to see how effective the work has been in combating the damp problem over the coming years.



Services continue as usual, with regular Sunday worship only being interrupted by a Patronal service in one of the other Benefice Churches', the next of which is at Witnesham on 15th August at 1000 hours. Otherwise there is a service at St Martin's each Sunday at 0930, and also 0800 hours on the fourth Sunday of each month. Come along one Sunday morning and enjoy worship with us, and a cup of coffee afterwards. Advance notice that on Sunday 26th September there will only be an evening service at Witnesham, to celebrate the Ordination of Michael Morton at the Cathedral in Bury St Edmunds that morning. A coach is being arranged for those who wish to attend the Ordination Service (approx cost £5), booking same can be made with Monica Pipe or Jim Punton.

Coming events are a Harvest Lunch, in lieu of Supper, on an October Sunday to be followed shortly thereafter by a Gift Day. The latter is very important for our continued survival, despite renewed giving by the congregation.

There will be another clearance of artificial flowers from the Churchyard shortly. Realising that they must be rather costly makes it onerous to bin them, so non-replacement would be appreciated. Glass jars, pint pots and vases should also be removed on Health and Safety grounds.

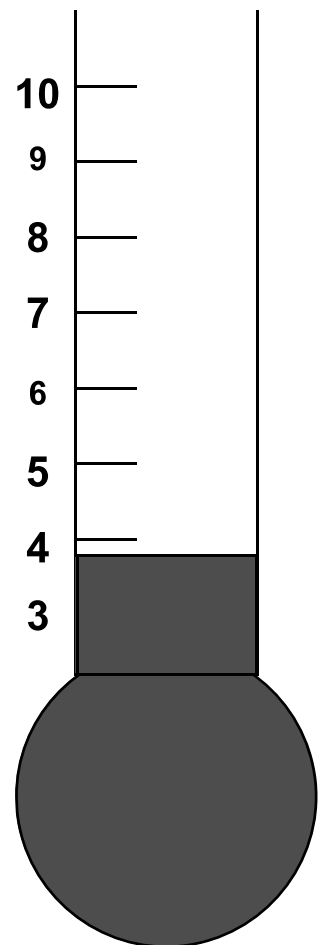
